

WHAT is STEP?

STEP is a world-class safety management system that dramatically improves safety performance among participants regardless of company size or type of work. Participating ABC members measure their safety processes and policies on 25 key components through a detailed questionnaire with the goal of implementing or enhancing safety programs that reduce jobsite incidents.

WHY Participate?

Every member wants to send its workers home safely every night. Take the first step towards achieving world-class safety by participating in STEP, whether you are beginning your safety journey or continuing to strengthen your performance. Getting started with STEP is free, and it can help you lower your workers compensation insurance rates.

WHO Should Participate?

Commercial and industrial contractors as well as suppliers who want to make a commitment to achieving world-class safety performance who perform work in the following NAICS codes.

Commercial and Industrial Contractors Include:

NAICS 236 Construction of Buildings

NAICS 237 Heavy and Civil Engineering Construction

SAFETY ALLIANCE

The ABC Safety Alliance Program recognizes member companies that have demonstrated an exceptional commitment to safety, resulting in safer job sites, fewer accidents and lower workers' comp. claims costs. Safety Alliance members are also encouraged to use this program as an additional tool in their business development and marketing efforts.

What are the benefits to participating?

- Save time and stress when L&I visits a jobsite. A focused inspection may be conducted rather than a full inspection.
- Third-party verification and review of a participant's safety program, enabling companies to address any areas that may need improving.
- Safety Alliance participants are able to market their company's safe work standards in bid packets, award presentations, and more.
- Qualifying members will be listed with the Dept. of L&I as a Safety Alliance participant and listed on the ABC website and in monthly safety emails.
- Participants will receive a framed certificate for their office, hard hat and jobsite stickers, along with an electronic copy of the Safety Alliance logo to be used on company websites and/or marketing materials.

How do I qualify?

To qualify for the Safety Alliance program a member must apply to ABC, score over 120 on the Safety Training Evaluation Process (STEP), and have their program evaluated by Tony Incrocci, ABC's Safety

The Supertrack card contains an RFID/QR unique code connected to the employee's account in cloud-based software, containing information on the complete training courses he/she takes and has been provided to ABC to be uploaded. The software allows the student to email or show his/her certifications to anyone.

The front of the card has the employee's name, employer's name, and the date the card was issued. The back contains the QR code with instructions for scanning the card and downloading the app. Anyone with the free **HAVOC SUPERTRACK** app can view and send the information needed. It works for both iOS and Android systems.

Apprenticeship

ABC supports apprenticeship programs and believes they are crucial to develop a strong, safe, and quality workforce. ABC does not support mandated apprenticeship requirements, nor the apprenticeship program approval process in Washington State, and has great concerns with upcoming mandates, specifically for 01 electrical apprentices.

PLA/CWAs

ABC opposes union-only project labor agreements and community workforce agreements because of the restrictions and additional costs they create. These agreements disproportionately restrict non-union contractors.

Prevailing Wage

ABC supports reforms to Washington's prevailing wage laws, so they more accurately reflect wages paid in the corresponding geographical area.

ABC believes to improve the liability insurance market for contractors, significant reforms to tort laws are needed. ABC supports legislation that would limit construction liability to defects or damage caused by the contractor, rather than owner's negligence or poor maintenance.


ABC's Member Suite is now open and available to members for their use. It includes two conference rooms, private office spaces, an education center and various wall mounted monitors.

construction lockdown mandates, and the deliberate and arbitrary distinction that was drawn between public and private construction companies. In addition, their research demonstrated the need for tax cuts and state program reforms including workers' compensation and unemployment insurance.
